

Non-native Species Alert

Parrot's Feather

Myriophyllum aquaticum



Grows in ponds, lakes, reservoirs, streams, canals and ditches. It can also be found as a terrestrial plant when a pond dries out.

It spreads by vegetative means by growth from small stem fragments.

Identification features (summer):

Stem: Fleshy and brittle.

Leaves: Feathery in appearance, bright green in Colour, arranged in whorls around the stem.

Flowers: None



Parrot's Feather can cause flooding by blocking watercourses and drainage channels.

It spreads rapidly and can dominate a water body, displacing native species.
