- Long term control

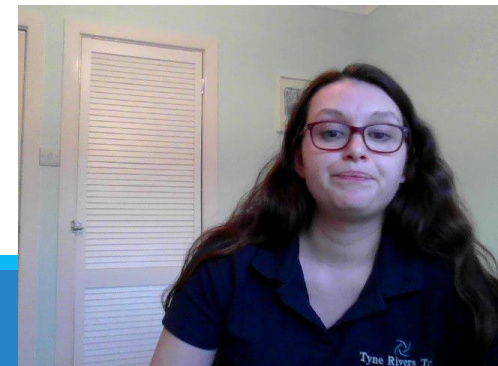

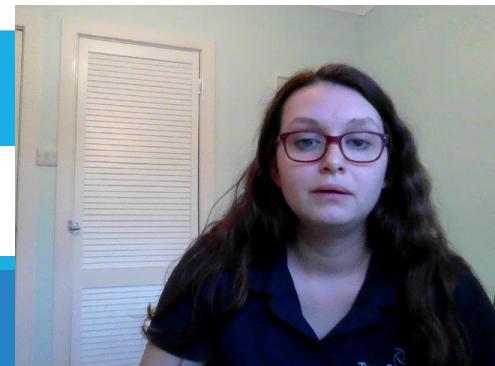
