£500 million investment in the natural environment

As part of net zero commitment to restoration of peatlands, woodlands, and other natural habitats

Nature Restoration Fund

At least £65 million for nature restoration and biodiversity projects over the next five years

Rainforest Action

Commitment to restore and expand Scotland's rainforest as a natural solution to the climate emergency

Annual Budget

- £34.2m in 2021-22

- £71.5m in 2022-23

- £13.5m in 2022-23

£0.5m initially in 2022-23







Nature Restoration Fund

Funding stream

Competitive Fund (launches later in 2022)

Nature Restoration Fund (EOIs in January, full applications in March)

The Edinburgh Process Fund (local authorities)

Size of grants offered

- Over £250,000 over3 to 5 years
- £25,000 to £250,000 over up to 2 years
- £2,500 to £20,000 in-year capital grant*

* Pilot by The Highland Council; other councils may take a different approach







- Enabling investment in tangible, effective marine and coastal restoration projects
- Donations SMEEF has already attracted the support of the offshore renewable energy sector
- Grants £500,000 initially available to enhance Scotland's coasts and seas
