### Your data is being collected by

The Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra) is the data controller for the personal data you give APHA.

The **Defra Data Protection Officer** is responsible for monitoring that APHA is meeting the requirements of Data Protection legislation and contact details are in APHA's Personal Information Charter.

# What your data is being collected and used for and the legal basis for processing

Personal data (names and email addresses) is being collected and stored for scientific research and to support APHA's functions. Specifically, to measure and monitor changes in awareness of invasive non-native species. This will help to inform future education and awareness-raising campaigns, which is in the public interest.

Legal bases for processing include:

- The names and email addresses are being processed using consent.
- The surveys are being conducted using anonymised data, not personal data. The project is being conducted under performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the controller

#### Who your data may be shared with

Your personal data (name, email address) will be stored securely at APHA, in accordance with GDPR regulations. Only authorised staff will have access to this data and only for the purposes of the RAPID Life Project.

Sub-contractors conducting workshops will collect personal data but will not retain this data after passing it on to APHA.

APHA will not share this personal data with any third parties, for any purpose. Anonymised responses to survey questions will be shared with sub-contractors for analysis purposes, but these responses will not be linked to names or email addresses. Personal data will not be shared with sub-contractors.

We may have to release information (including personal data and commercial information) under the following legislation:

- General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)
- UK Data Protection Act 2018
- Freedom of Information Act 2000
- Environmental Information Regulations 2004

We will not allow any unwarranted breach of confidentiality and we will not act in contravention of our obligations under UK data protection legislation.

#### How long we will keep your data for

Personal data will be retained for the duration of the RAPID Life Project and the RAPID Life Afterlife, which ends in July 2025. Beyond this point, data will not be retained and all personal data will be deleted. In addition, participants can at any point choose to have their personal data deleted from our files. #### **Consequences of not providing personal data**

You do not have to provide us with your personal data. You may choose to provide us with your personal data (name and email address) if you choose to do so, by informed consent.

For consent-based processing, you have a right to revoke this at any given time. You can choose to opt out at any time by informing us that you no longer wish us to have your personal data. At this point, we will immediately delete your personal data from our files.

#### The use of automated decision making or profiling

The information you provide is not connected with:

- individual decision making, in other words making a decision solely by automated means without any human involvement
- or profiling, in other words automated processing of personal data to evaluate certain things about an individual

# The transfer of data outside the European Economic Area (EEA)

The data you provide will not be transferred outside of the EEA.
