

# Have you seen this animal?

Raccoon dog *Nyctereutes procyonoides*



## What is it?

A small, nocturnal fox-sized animal, originally from East Asia that looks similar to a raccoon. This species can have serious, detrimental impacts if they escape from captivity:

- Their diet includes fruit, insects, small rodents, birds and eggs making them an important predator of small birds and amphibians of conservation concern, and game species.
- They can compete with native carnivores for food and shelter.
- They could be a vector of a range of zoonotic diseases such as rabies, *Echinococcus multilocularis* and *Trichinella species*.
